

Regulation for sport to World Company Sport Games 2026 Frederikshavn, Denmark

Sport: HANDBALL

Competition form: Teams tournament

Venue: Arena Nord, Harald Nielsen Plads 9, 9900 Frederikshavn

Dates: June 11.-12.-13. 2026

Schedule: Matches will start at 9.00 in the morning and end about 17.30/18.00 on the

11.-12. and at Final day the 13. it ends no later than 14.00!

Events you do not want to miss:

Opening Ceremony June 10, In the evening!

Dinner and party in Arena Nord June 11 and 12 from 18.00

Open Run 5 og 10 K, June 13 at 16.00! Closing Ceremony June 13 in the evening!

Prizes: Medals for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place teams in each category.

Required Qualifications: Participation is open to all team members who are duly registered, have

paid the registration fee.

Categories: Men Open and Men Open 40 (40+)

Women Open and Women Open 40(40+)

Numbers of players per team: Min 7 and max 14 players per team per game. *Note: The organizers reserve the right to modify the number of categories*

based on the number of registered participants.

Game format: Participating teams will be divided into groups, where each team will play

against all other teams in the group. Afterward, there will be matched for all

based on results ending with finals between the best-placed teams.

The criteria for results of the groups are as follows:

1. Most points won in the group.

- 2. Most points won in head-to-head matches against the other teams.
- 3. Highest goal difference in head-to-head matches against the other teams.
- 4. Most goals scored in head-to-head matches against the other teams.
- 5. Highest goal difference in all group matches
- 6. Most goals scored in all group matches.
- 7. Drawing of lots.

After the preliminary phase, in the qualification matches, in case of a draw, seven-meter throws (a series of three throws) will follow immediately.

Each participant can only play for one team.

In each match, only 16 players can play. The list of players must be submitted to the referees at least 10 minutes before the match.

Special Provisions:

- No Team Time Out.
- No time stoppage in case of a seven-meter throw.
- No time stoppage in case of a 2-minute suspension.
- The team defined as the visiting team (Team B) must change jerseys if they are of the same color or not clearly different colors
- The team is self-provided with resin!

Gametime

Men and women: 2×15 minutes with a 1-minute break. Men and Women 40: 2×15 minutes with a 1-minute break. The pre-game warm-up will last 5 minutes on the field.

Matches will start according to the schedule listed for each field. The waiting time is 5 minutes. However, if a team does not show up or is not ready to start the game, the score will be set at 5-0 in favor of the present team.

Officiating:

There will be referees in all games.

Team Presentation:

Teams must be present at the check-in station at the sport facility 30 minutes before the start of the match. The team manager must submit the RS (Roster Sheet) form with the list of players participating in the match for each match. If the team is not on the field at the scheduled start time, they will forfeit the match.

Note: All players must be present on the field at the scheduled start time of the match they are to play – only the local sport facilitator can give a dispensation for this.

Team Manager:

Each team must have its own team manager, who can also be the coach. The team manager must sign the list of players (Roster Sheet).

Results:

The results will be published on the official information system "Goodiepack", in the handball section.

Doping:

Participation is not allowed if you have tested positive in a doping-test 2 years before!

There can be unannounced doping test – if so, participant is obliged to be tested.

Protests:

All protests related to the conduct of the championship must be submitted in writing to the Head Judge at the local sport facilitation within a maximum of 30 minutes after the conclusion of the match, accompanied by a deposit of €30.00, which will be refunded if the appeal is accepted.

Final Provisions:

Each participant travels and participates in the Games at their own risk. The organization is responsible only for first aid. It is mandatory to always carry a copy of personal insurance policy.
